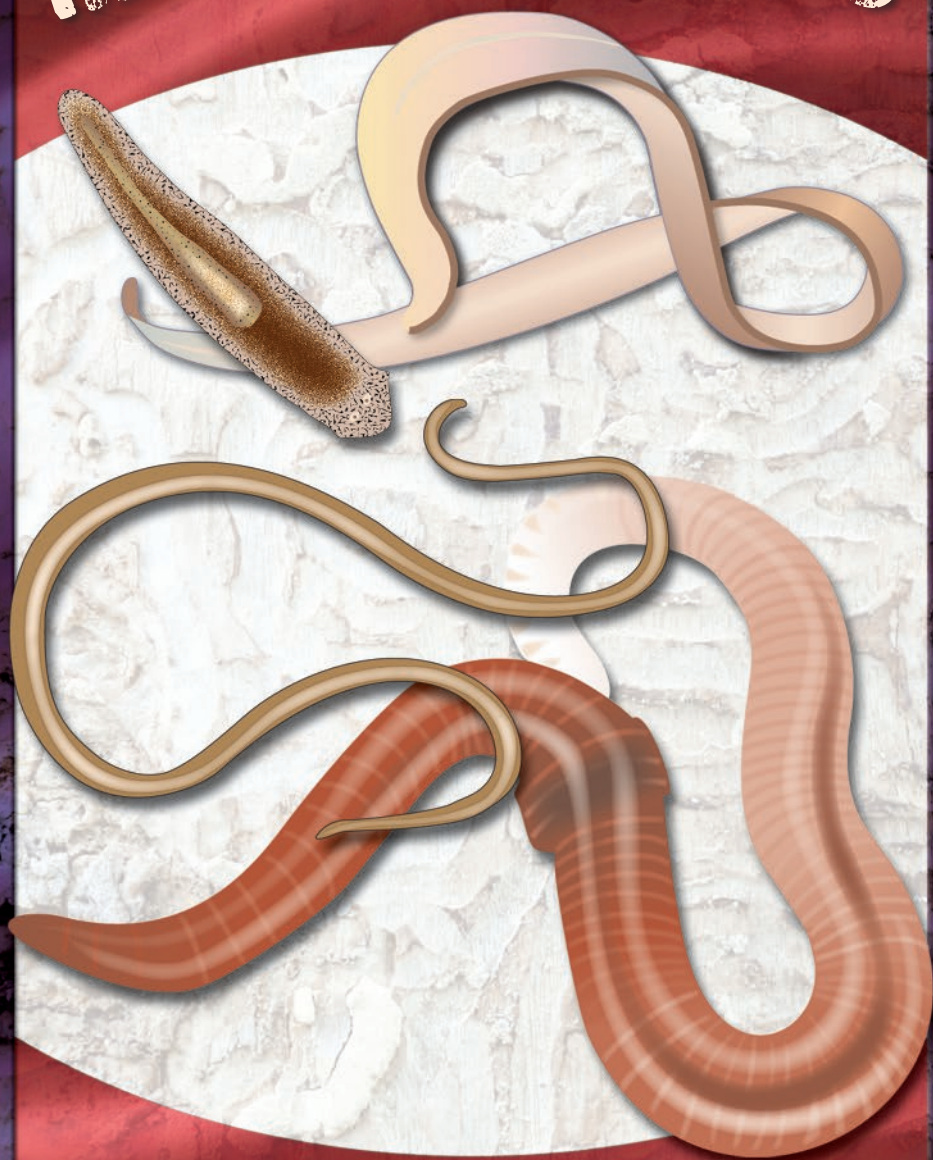


# MY WORM GUIDE

Some worms live in animals.

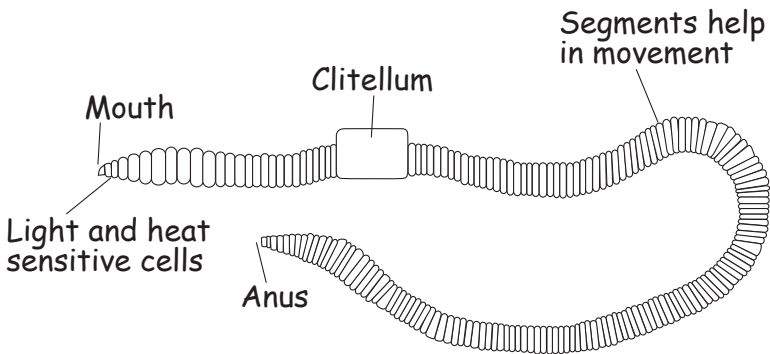


# Do worms have eyes?

Worms have body parts that help them feel.

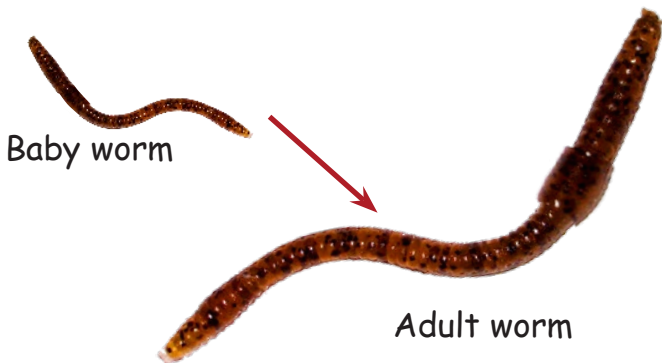


# Is a caterpillar a worm?

Butterfly

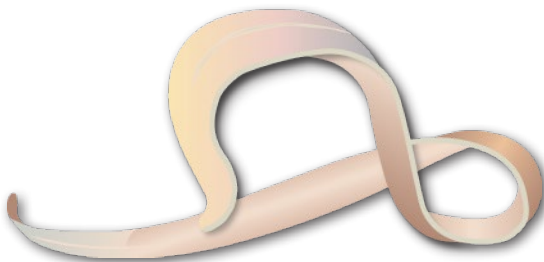

1. flatworms

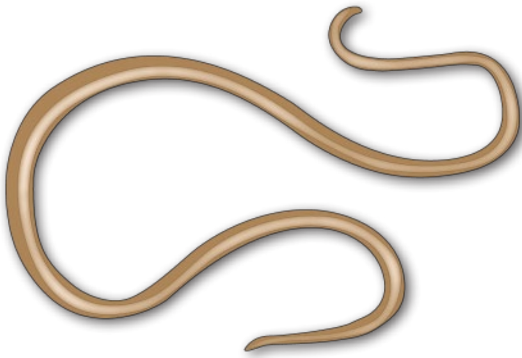


2. ribbon worms

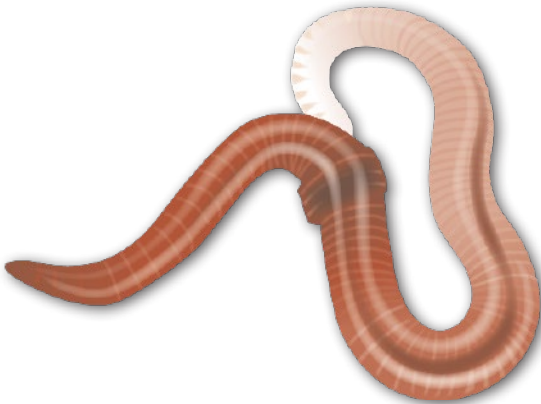
